
CHINESE CHARACTER STROKE ORDER

The rules when writing characters (with examples) are as follows:

- 1. Write from top to bottom, and left to right (\equiv)
- 2. Horizontal before vertical (- in +)
- 3. Character-spanning strokes last (in 聿)
- 4. Diagonals right-to-left before diagonals left-to-right (丿 in 文)
- 5. Center before outside in vertically symmetrical characters (in 水)
- 6. Enclosures before contents (put people inside first, then close the door) (\square in \square)
- 7. Left vertical stroke before enclosing stroke (in □)
- 8. Bottom enclosures last (迮 in 道)
- 9. Dots and minor strokes last (\setminus in \pm)
